

WVU HEALTH SYSTEM

- The WVU Health System is West Virginia's largest health system and the state's largest employer with approximately 30,000 employees.
- The WVU Health System comprises 24 hospitals, including the new WVU Medicine Children's Hospital, and five institutes: the WVU Cancer Institute, the WVU Critical Care and Trauma Institute, the WVU Eye Institute, the WVU Heart and Vascular Institute, and the WVU Rockefeller Neuroscience Institute.
- The WVU Cancer Institute is making strategic investments in cancer care and research to achieve the state's first National Cancer Institute designation.

WVU FOUNDATION ENDOWMENT

- Total Foundation assets were \$2.9 billion as of Dec. 31, 2023. Included in total assets are endowed assets, non-endowed assets, and assets managed by WVUF for WVU-affiliated agencies.
- 3,576 endowed funds
- Average size of endowed fund (market value): \$240,812
- 2,279 endowed and non-endowed scholarships
- 162 endowed faculty chairs and professorships
- The net investment return for the Long-Term Investment Pool for fiscal year 2023 was 0.3%

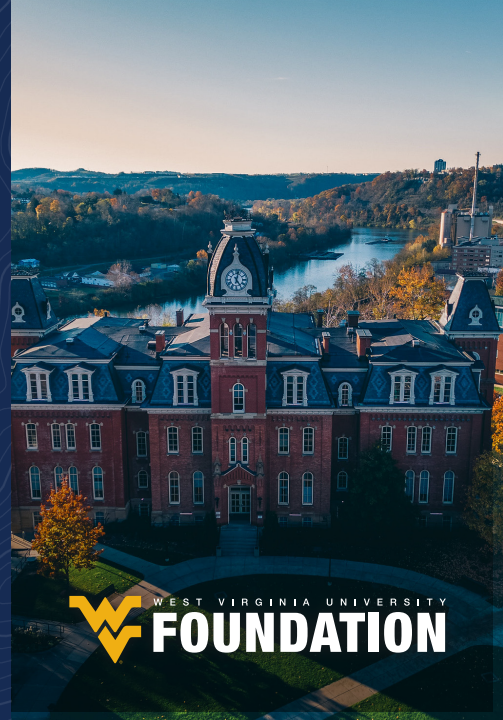

WVU AT A GLANCE

- Public, land-grant institution

ESTIMATED AVERAGE COST

For full-time students 2023-2024 (Morgantown campus)

- In-state tuition/fees per semester: \$4,824
- Out-of-state tuition/fees per semester: \$13,680
- Average room and board per semester: \$6,510

Room and board are the same for in- and out-of-state residents.



FINANCIAL AID AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Each year, WVU (Morgantown campus) awards over \$400 million in financial aid, including \$158 million in grants and scholarships. Approximately 80% of freshmen receive some form of scholarship aid. The approximate cost of an endowment for a full scholarship (in-state tuition, average room and board) is \$565,000.

STATE APPROPRIATION AS A PERCENT OF TOTAL BUDGET

WVU's budget – which includes the academic component of the Health Sciences schools – is approximately \$1.2 billion. Given state appropriations reductions since 2013, current state appropriations account for only about 15% of WVU's total budget. This means that your support for WVU is now more critical than ever.
