

FINANCIAL AID AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Each year, WVU (Morgantown campus) awards over \$400 million in financial aid, including \$50 million in grants and scholarships. Approximately 78% of freshmen receive some form of scholarship aid. The approximate cost of an endowment for a full scholarship (in-state tuition, average room and board) is \$425,000.

STATE APPROPRIATION AS A PERCENT OF TOTAL BUDGET

WVU's budget – which includes the academic component of the Health Sciences schools – is approximately \$1 billion. Over the past eight years, the University has seen a reduction of nearly \$45 million to its base State funding. State appropriations only account for approximately 16% of the University's total budget. Moreover, the state of West Virginia does not provide support for building construction projects similar to most other states. The reduction in State support means that your support for WVU is critical.
