FINANCIAL AID AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Each year, WVU (Morgantown campus) awards over \$400 million in financial aid, including \$152 million in grants and scholarships. Approximately 80% of freshmen receive some form of scholarship aid. The approximate cost of an endowment for a full scholarship (in-state tuition, average room and board) is \$545,000.

STATE APPROPRIATION AS A PERCENT OF TOTAL BUDGET

WVU's budget – which includes the academic component of the Health Sciences schools – is approximately \$1 billion. Given state appropriations reductions since 2013, current state appropriations account for only about 16% of WVU's total budget. Also, WVU receives no state support for building construction projects. This means that your support for WVU is now more critical than ever.
